LAURA SPONBERG, ELDER

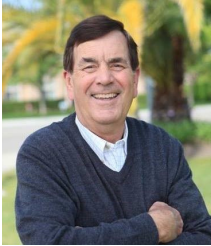

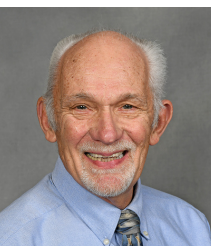
NANCY MALER, DEACON
