

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## A Framework For Our Future

When I consider all that God has done among us in 2014, I am overwhelmed. I believe it has been an incredibly important year for our church. In last year's report I declared that 2013 was a year to build on. As I consider 2014, I believe that building is exactly what occurred. Let me give you some examples.

In May we finalized our Purpose Statement and Core Values. This was the culmination of more than a year's worth of work, and it was an important building block for our church. The Session created these statements after hours of studying Scripture, dialoguing together about FPC Fresno, and listening to your feedback provided at last year's annual meeting. Our Core Values are transformational relationship, partnership, and leadership. These Core Values should be present in everything we do as a church. We always want to be deepening healthy intergenerational relationships with each other and with our neighbors, co-workers, and friends. We always want to be finding ways to partner with each other and other organizations for the advancement of the Gospel in our city and world. We always want to be developing leaders to serve God's Kingdom wherever He places them. Articulating these Core Values helps us live into our particular and God-given identity as First Presbyterian Church of Fresno.

The Purpose Statement guides all our actions; it is our reason for being. Do you know it?

### **OUR PURPOSE IS TO ENGAGE TOGETHER IN CHRIST'S WORK** OF MAKING DISCIPLES FOR THE REDEEMING TRANSFORMATION OF OUR CITY AND WORLD.

I absolutely love this purpose statement because it frames our activity as participation in the work of God for a result that is outside of ourselves. We want everything we do to be about His Kingdom and not our own. The finalization of Core Values and Purpose Statements was an important milestone for First Presbyterian Church, Fresno. They build on the long history and heritage of First Pres, but they also point us to the future.

One of the most important outcomes of this work was the launch of Community Groups. During the summer we had Community Groups meet on campus each Sunday to build a base of relationship that could be expressed outwardly in neighborhoods all around our cities.

Then, at the end of the summer, each group made the imperative step of meeting in the context of their own region. Now, Community Groups are meeting on the second Sunday of each month. They exist for the purpose of building Christian community, making new disciples, and living out the Gospel in our neighborhoods. We still have a long way to go in developing Community Groups into all that they can be, but I love that we were willing to try this new initiative. When I consider the possibilities of how God could use the Community Group infrastructure to help us carry out our church's Purpose Statement, I get very excited.

From my view, I believe the launch of Community Groups and the finalization of our Core Values and Purpose Statement were the most important organizational changes we made in 2014. However, there were many other important initiatives and ministries that were launched this year. Have you heard of TwelveTen@FPC? TwelveTen is a weekly lunchtime Bible study held on our campus. Our dream is to engage the 40,000 people who work downtown with the message of the Gospel, and the good news it brings about work. We've also launched the Third Thursday Men's Bible Study to connect our men in discipleship. We started the Sunday morning Link Crew to increase the hospitality factor on our campus. A new college ministry was started this fall. The new Care Coordinator ministry is helping to link all our resources for individuals and families in need or crisis. We added intermittent First Pres Forums to the Education Hour to enhance our communication as a congregation. We're taking our participation with Art Hop to the streets by literally bringing food, music, and a warm welcome to M street on the first Thursday night of each month. We took on new mission partners to see God's Kingdom come in places from San Francisco to Siberia. All these and still more that are listed in the pages of this report. It is written by many hands from various perspectives, but the theme is constant. God has been at work among us. I hope that you will take the time to read this document with an attitude of thanksgiving.

Meanwhile, the Vaccaros are thriving in Fresno. This year, Diane and I feel like we experienced the final stages of transition to our post here at FPC Fresno. Our family is settled and doing well. I am deeply grateful for the faithful prayers that have been offered for us. God is at work among us too.

Finally, please know that I consider it an incredible privilege to be the Senior Pastor of this wonderful church. I love it! I love being part of the story that God is writing among us – a story of reconciliation, healing, redeeming transformation, and mission. To Him be all glory, honor, and praise.

## **Clerk's Report**

This has been a year of sowing new seeds and starting new ventures for First Pres. As we take stock of where we have come over the past year, it is clear that much has been accomplished. For 2015, we are praying that these seeds will bear an increasing amount of fruit.

The attendance this year was down from last year, but was about even with the 2011 and 2012. See the attendance chart for details. On a positive note, our Christmas Eve services had an increase of over 100 people from the prior year.

The congregation responded wonderfully to Pastor Jeremy's December letter regarding our financial needs. Year-end giving was up considerably. We did not receive as much as budgeted, but we did receive more than our expenses.

All of the ministry teams were careful and diligent about expenses this year. The Facility and Grounds and Personnel teams were able to take advantage of temporary decreases in needs which saved a lot of money for the church.

Next year's budget is exactly the same total amount as this year's: \$1,260,000. Some of the line items have been changed to adjust to our changing needs.

Reviewing my 2014 calendar has been a good way to refresh my memory about the past year – a lot of things happen in 365 days! I know that numbers don't tell the whole story, but I want to give a few stats to get started. In 2014, I served communion ten times, preached eight sermons, baptized five children, walked with families and friends through three memorial services, and

officiated at two weddings. I met and talked individually with fifty people for connections, counseling, and encouragement, and many others for monthly and specially-called meetings relating to ministry teams, deacons, and session. One very special pastoral visit I made was to Delma and Freddie Rodriguez just before Delma passed away; we had a sweet time of prayer and anointing together, and I'm so grateful that I had the privilege of being with them. There's much more I could say, and this is all normal "pastor stuff", but I hope it helps you know a little more about what my days look like.

Twenty-fourteen has been an exciting, growing time for our Deacons and Care ministries. It's been a year of team-building, visioning, changes in internal structure, and added capacity for ministry to our congregation. In 2014, we shifted our focus toward "leading the church in its ministries of care and compassion", and we're in the process of revamping our Deacons Ministry Handbook to bring it up to date. That means our Deacons will be inviting many additional people to participate in ministry and service opportunities in the coming years. We want to spread the joy of serving Christ and his church!

Two significant changes in the structure of our Deacons are the addition of our Care-Coordinators ministry, and bringing all of FPC's Prayer ministries together under the umbrella of Deacons. We'll continue to work out and refine all that those changes mean, but we're definitely well on our way. Our chaplains, Rosemary Avery and Susan Glover, along with Pastor Paul Armstrong, continue to minister faithfully and well to those who are ill, homebound, or in crisis. What wonderful servants all our chaplains and deacons are!

The Community Growth ministry team is the other area where I have involvement on Sunday mornings and evenings. Between two membership classes, Gospel in Life, and our summer Community Groups initiative, I have been involved much of the year with adult education between services. I am looking forward to teaching four weeks in



February on a topic that's still being firmed up. I'm also currently leading, and looking forward to building, the leadership team for the Fresno/Central/Edison Community Group in 2015.

You may remember that for the last year I've been part of the EPC's Women in Ministry national committee. I am excited to let you know that in June of 2015 I will become the chair of this committee, that encompasses all aspects of women's ministries in the EPC. This is a time of enormous challenge, as the nature of the committee and even the structure of the EPC at the national level is in transition. This is a time of great opportunity to be part of something that's newly emerging. I'm committed through June of 2017, and will very much appreciate your prayers not only for me, but for the process and direction of the committee, as well as our denomination and presbyteries.

I am grateful to God, and to you all, for the privilege of ministering at First Pres, and I'm excited to continue growing as a leader and pastor in 2015. The Lord bless and keep you.


We provide prayers, love, spiritual and emotional support via our In-Touch, Prayer, Communication, Care-Coordinators and Transportation ministries.

### **ONGOING MINISTRIES**

**MEN'S MINISTRY** in 2014 had an excellent Men's conference and is looking forward to Men's Conference 2015 with a plan for a two-day meeting. Troy Wilson, from The Table church in San Francisco, will be our speaker. In 2014, we initiated Third Thursday, a monthly men's Bible study that is off to a great start with attendance, relationships, and teachers.

**WOMEN'S MINISTRY** continues to offer regular Bible studies on campus Thursday mornings, and off campus on Tuesday mornings. For 2015, rather than offering another DVD series on Monday evenings, our teachers will be live and inperson. Come for this 11 weeks study of Matthew with Rachel York and Diane Vaccaro, beginning January 19<sup>th</sup>.

Our 2014 Women's Conference was held the first weekend in October and was attended by approximately 70 women. For the 2015 conference, we decided to make some changes because we want even more of our women to be able to attend. Our plan is for a twoday retreat to be held right here in town. There is much interest in expanding the leadership of women's ministry to help plan future events.

**ADULT SUNDAY EDUCATION has** enjoyed Jeremy and others leading RAP classes based on the sermon scripture of the day. "Grief Share" started in 2014 with a one-day "Surviving the Holidays" program, and will resume a regular 13-week class that begins January 4. Pastor Lana facilitated our spring and fall membership classes, as well as Tim Keller's Gospel in Life series. New in 2014 is Partner Spotlight, a joint effort of Missions and Community Growth. We wanted to allow time during the education hour to hear from, pray for and visit with our many mission partners as they share

what God is doing where they serve. The Community Growth Ministry Team looks forward to 2015 knowing we serve a sovereign God. Our desire is to be sensitive to where God leads us in ministry, and to equip and encourage the congregation of First Presbyterian Church to live into God's mission.

More of you stepped in to help in significant ways for our monthly Neighbors aRe Us dinners and for

December's Pantry Food Box distribution.

Many of you are connecting in new ways with Oscar and Julie Rodriguez as they



engage with kids and families from their home on Glenn, continuing the Halloween Carnival tradition and starting a Happy Birthday Jesus Party event this year. We look forward to the fruit God will bring from these partnerships in 2015.

Marcie York went on her first ever short term trip joining the team her daughter Rachel lead to serve in India this summer.

In 2015, Marty Martin will return to Cambodia in January. Joining him on that Global Health Outreach team is John Verwey. In February, Erin Matlak will head to Nicaragua on a Students International Team. We're excited about the two team trips we're organizing for the summer of 2015. The Vaccaro family will be a part of the team going to Erseke, Albania late June – July. The Blodgett family and another 25 or so High School students, family members, or youth advisors will be serving with Students International in the Dominican Republic mid-July.



Marty, Joanie and Josh Martin plan to serve with GHO in the DR this summer as well. In addition, we'll be inviting college students to consider attending InterVarsity's URBANA mission conference in December.

We launched the Partner Spotlight as a regular, twice a month offering during the Education Hour this fall to provide a regular time to hear from or about mission partners transforming our city and world as well as those we've sent out from our congregation for short term service. This works on both our caring for missionaries and increased congregational awareness goals at the same time.

We celebrated the 40 years of ministry in Japan of long time partners Steve and Martie Tarter, marking their transition to their next chapter of life and ministry in Portland. We undergirded Linda Osborne's transition from 8 months to year-round service in Erseke, Albania. In 2015 we hope to see the Francolinos return to Romania, serving with EPC's World Outreach. We look forward to other ways we can strengthen our missional connections with other EPC churches and projects in the coming year.

### Outreach

The mission of the Outreach Ministry Team is to provide opportunities for the congregation to effectively reach out to our downtown Fresno neighborhood, our own spheres of influence

(personal neighborhoods and workplaces), as well as to the greater Fresno community, and to equip church members to easily "tell their story" when the opportunity arises.

In collaboration with the Community Growth team, we launched TwelveTen@FPC in February of 2014. It's a weekly Bible Study for the downtown workplace community that happens Fridays at, you guessed it, 12:10pm. The heartbeat of TwelveTen is that it would expand the church's role as a spiritual resource for this workplace community.

We organized a Saturday of Service after Easter this year to



engage us in some new ways to serve in our spheres of influences. We knew that Community Groups were coming, so

prior to their launching, we asked some folks to plan service projects in their neighborhoods. We had great activities and great

participation from folks of all ages. And then when Community Groups went off campus this summer, many of them did



something much like our Saturday of Service.

Another major emphasis for our

team was to re-engage with Art Hop, the monthly Arts Council event that happens the 1st Thursday of the month in the Downtown and Tower area. The Community Growth team launched our participation on a quarterly basis as an Art Hop Venue a few years ago. We re-engaged starting in October, increasing to monthly participation as a venue, developing a team that is seeking to enhance our visibility during Art Hop (with food and music in the parking lot when weather permits) and scheduling artists.

We organized a small but effective team of folks to Welcome Walk the expanding condo and apartment dwellings near our church. We greeted folks with fruit from our Farmer's Market and invitation cards to our Christmas Eve Services on a beautiful December Saturday morning. We will definitely plan more of this in 2015. There are two more Granville Urban projects in the works quite near us. Will you join us in praying that God would give us creative and effective ways to engage with these new neighbors in 2015?

We hope in this new year that we can more effectively empower and encourage you as you seek to share Christ's love, hope and invitation to new life in your spheres of influence. We also hope that together we can find ways to intersect and engage with those who live and work so close to us who do not yet know Christ or need encouragement in their walk with him.



2014 was a positive year in Worship! Over the summer we

moved to a single service format, integrating the styles of both worship services. On occasion we served communion in the pews in addition to the more usual intinction method. We also continued offering 3 services on Christmas Eve. We worshipped the Lord in 95 services this year including Sunday morning, Christmas Eve, Easter and Holy Week for a grand total of 27,066 worshipers.

We fully implemented Media Shout for our screen presentations, allowing for more creativity and flow in the presentations. Two new sound techs were added as well as some new screen operators. Our church has been greatly blessed by the many volunteers in music, ushers/greeters, sound, screens, decorations, wedding coordinators and so forth.

Many people became involved in the Worship Ministry Team as we strove to honor and glorify the Lord in worship. As we look to the new year, we envision a continued emphasis on building up the

Worship Teams and developing our leaders and musicians.
